

NOTE TO MENSANS REGARDING FAMILY MEMBERS

Contrary to what some might think, most of our meetings are social gatherings where we talk about the same sorts of things that non-Mensa folks talk about. In fact, it is often difficult to tell who is a Mensa member and who is not. Some of our spouses regularly attend Mensa functions and enjoy it tremendously. Also, all of the youngsters in our families are considered by Mensa to be "Young Mensans", even if they are not members in their own right. This allows them to participate in any and all chapter activities without feeling like outsiders. This is especially important to our young Mensa members that have siblings and friends, and our older Mensa members that have grandkids, nieces and nephews, kids at home, etc.

MENSA SURVEY RESULTS

In our monthly meetings, we have discussed ways that we can make our group more active with doing things as a group. That is, doing something other than just eating out once a month. So, rather than take our best guess at what everyone wants, I decided to put together a short survey online that would take less than 5 minutes for each Mensan to complete. We sent out invitations by email and in our monthly newsletter. There were not as many responses as we would like, but we did get enough to give us some idea of where your thoughts were on what direction to take. In short, while some of our members would welcome the idea of outings and socializing as a group, many of our members also indicate that they are not much interested in the activities of the chapter and are members of Mensa for other reasons. Here are the questions we asked, along with the results:

6. I am a member to contribute to society through Mensa (2.31)
7. I am a member for chapter outings (2.47)
8. I don't care about being a member now, but did then (2.61)
9. I am a member for young Mensan activities (1.92)
10. I am a member for the national newsletter (2.93)
11. I am a member for the local newsletter (3.00)
12. I am a member for networking potential (2.53)
13. I am interested in chapter newsletter activities (2.84)
14. I am interested in eList activities (2.53)
15. I am interested in chapter website activities (2.70)
16. I am interested in a Planetarium outing (2.84)
17. I am interested in a Zoo outing (2.38)
18. I am interested in a Legislature Visit (2.61)
19. I am interested in an Art Museum outing (3.07)

When asked what for opinions to improve our chapter, the following were among the comments (some comments removed if not related to the question, or if the identity of the respondent was apparent)

- More things to do throughout area, not just in Montgomery area.
- Distance and schedule are the main obstacles to my participation. If I were closer to Montgomery and had more free time, I would participate in the local Mensa chapter activities. *(some content removed here)* Until I am able to participate to a fuller extent, I give my thanks and regards to those that are keeping the Mensa chapters going and available.
- Meet on the east side of town more often.
- I have not attended any chapter meetings. *(some content removed here)* I'm busy like everyone else, and just haven't set aside the time to attend any chapter meetings. Thanks much for the very professional looking and informative newsletter, as well as your time and efforts for our Mensa Chapter
- Would like to see some mentorship for the Young Mensans and maybe some get together events for them. Maybe develop something for the Gifted Kids in/out of Mensa to increase membership and participation. *(some content removed here)*
- I am interested in outings with the group, but I feel that Montgomery-Wiregrass Mensa comprises such a large geographic area that it will be difficult to achieve a high level of participation.
- I have no opinions on the local chapter at this time *(some content removed here)*.
- I feel good that I was able to become a Mensan (years ago) but I am definitely not a horn blower. If you are a member, it shows in all you do. That is why my survey did not provide for very many Mensan ID outings. *(some content removed here)* Again, as well as you can see from the survey, I am very interested and sometimes involved in governmental activities. *(some content removed here)* I think your last newsletter (and the survey idea) was great.
- *(some content removed here)* I have no new ideas.

CONCLUSIONS:

In looking at the types of outings that interested the respondents the most, it seems that going to see a play, going to the art museum, and perhaps going to the space museum interest folks the most. Though a planetarium outing is not high on the list, several people did indicate a desire to go. I have a contact at the Gayle Planetarium, near Jackson Hospital in Montgomery. If someone wants to contact them for an outing, I have a contact name. We do have some funds available to help with outings, but we need someone to plan and coordinate each of them. So, here it is...
